HEALTH AND WELLNESS

There's a reason why registered dietitians recommend eating seasonally. It's because freshly-harvested food is at its peak when it comes to nutrition and flavor. In the winter months, citrus fruit, like oranges, are readily available and incredibly delicious.

That bright burst of sweet orange tastes just likes warm sunshine! That's enough to brighten your mood, even according to studies. Plus, oranges boast an impressive nutrition profile. They are a natural source of folate. And citrus foods, like oranges, have a unique plant compound called hesperidin, which has been shown to support blood pressure health, among other positive outcomes.

It's also a great way to get vitamin C, a key nutrient that promotes a healthy immune system. And since winter is cold and flu season, grabbing an orange is a delicious way to get a little extra immune support.

Also, oranges can last up to 10 days on your countertop (if you see it, you're more likely to eat it!) and up to 21 days in the crisper drawer of your fridge, according to Foodkeeper, a program developed by the USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service on consumer's questions about food safety and storage. That means you can buy a big bag on your next shopping trip and enjoy the fruit all-month.

Our February Guest Speaker is Mr. Viet Hoang, City of Torrance Deputy Manager. He has been the staff liaison for the Social Services Commission since 2016. The Commission's jurisdiction includes people experiencing homelessness, Veterans Affairs, adults with developmental disabilities and youth with special needs. In addition to his work with the Commission, Viet is responsible for organizational and leadership development at the city. He will give us an update on the 3290 Temporary Housing Village, aka the Tiny Houses, which opened in late June 2022. Six months into the Pilot Program, Torrance Councilmembers have expressed concerns about extending the lease period beyond the 12 month period. Perhaps, you have some questions about the Tiny Houses that Mr. Hoang can answer.

Just a reminder, we will resume collecting food items at our February General Meeting, for The Volunteer Center's (TVC) Food Pantry. 
Our club has really been growing with the addition of so many impressive new members. We're ready to support the wide range of club activities in order to continue to build our membership.

I recently saw an article by Jeff Dunn, Senior Commerce Writer for engadget sale for an all-time low of \$400. He referenced finding the 64GB version on sale for \$400 at Amazon and Best Buy matching the price. These prices are less than you would pay directly with Apple. As of January 9, 2023, only the Starlight and Purple models were available for this low price.

Why do I mention this? This would be a great device for TWC members who are trying to do Zoom by IPhone or other small handheld devices to have a much better video conferencing experience. Also, for those members who do not have a tablet or computer, like perhaps some of our members in assisted living centers or staying with relatives, this small mini IPad can handle many applications including Zoom and thereby give even more of our members access to our online hybrid meetings. As a club, we can find ways to help these members get connected. Often the assisted living centers have WIFI that the device could piggyback onto, and we can also rethink how to number and password our Zoom meetings if there were several more members that would connect in with such a device.

- "Minor's Publicity Release" form
- "Creative Arts Waiver" form

March 17th is the absolute last day that entries can be submitted and judged. The Marina District Meeting will be held at the SANTA MONICA Woman's Club, location: 1210 4th Street.

April 17

CFWC - First Place District winning entries ONLY in each category, will be submitted to State for Judging and State winners will be submitted to National.

PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST: ENTRIES DUE TO CFWC BY MONDAY, APRIL 17, 2023

There are two main categories for the photography contest:

- **I. THE WORLD IN PICTURES:** These photographs showcase the people, places, and things at home and around the world that impact our lives in a meaningful way, as expressed in these three categories:
 - a. Our World Up Close—Create a visual that offers a novel viewpoint or a macro image that takes the viewer into a whole new, tiny world.
 - **b. Natural Wonders**—Use wide angles and panoramas, or moody landscape images, to showcase mountains, meadows, sandhills, rivers, waterfalls, oceans, deserts, or any other magnificent vista.
 - c. Reflections—Feature a setting, situation, or landmark that brings back poignant memories, or capture a fleeting image reflected in glass, water, or another mirrored surface.



II. GFWC LIVING THE VOLUNTEER SPIRIT: These photographs capture the special moments in the lives of GFWC clubwomen as they meet, plan, advocate, volunteer, or celebrate, in groups or one- on-one.



RULES FOR PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST:

- Photographs must be the original work of the member submitting the photograph;
- All contest photographers must be dues paying members of an active GFWC Club;
 - Exception: CFWC will be judging Student Photography at the state level (however, GFWC does not have this category at the international level);
- Photographs must be taken between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022;
- Contestants must be considered an amateur photographer;
- A signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver must be included with each submission (FOR MINORS UNDER THE
 AGE OF 18: A SIGNED MINOR'S CONSENT AND RELEASE FORM AND a MINOR'S PUBLICITY RELEASE
 FORM MUST BE INCLUDED WITH EACH ENTRY, in addition to the Creative Arts Waiver.

Artwork Guidelines for Photography Contest:

- Photographs may be vertical/portrait OR horizontal/landscape;
- Photographs must be the original work of the member submitting the photo;
- Each photograph must be an 8" x 10" print or digital file equivalent (a high-resolution digital copy of the submission is encouraged).
- All <u>printed</u> photographs must be mounted on a rigid 8" x 10" board and overall thickness may not exceed 3/8 inch. NO mattes, frames, or hangers;
- · Photographs taken may be taken using film or digital cameras and may be color or black/white;
- Photographs will NOT be returned;
- Each photograph must have a label affixed to its back with the following information:
 - Contest Name: The World in Pictures, with category OR GFWC Living the Volunteer Spirit;
 - Photographer's Name, email address, mailing address, and phone number;
 - Club Name, District, Area, and State of the sponsoring club;
 - Title and brief caption giving location, date, and other pertinent information about the photograph;
 - Arrow indicating top of the photograph.
