Each entry must have a CFWC "Photography Contest Entry Form" attached to the back of the backboard and a Creative Arts Waiver. Students must have Photography Contest Entry Form, Creative Arts Waiver AND Minor's Publicity Release and Minors Consent and Release form.

# TECHNOLOGY CHAIR IN THE CORNER

Here are five charging "don'ts" to keep in mind for everyday life and travel:

Don't use unauthorized chargers: Using non-certified or unauthorized chargers can pose risks to your devices. Stick to chargers provided by reputable manufacturers to ensure compatibility and safety. This means that the cheap look alike on sites like Amazon may not be the best charger for you to use and it's advisable to use the OEM, original equipment manufactured, that came in the box with your device.

Don't overcharge: Avoid leaving your devices plugged in for extended periods after they are fully charged. Overcharging can degrade battery life over time. Unplug your devices once they reach a full charge.

Don't expose chargers to extreme conditions: Avoid exposing chargers to extreme temperatures, whether it's too hot or too cold. Extreme temperatures can affect the performance and safety of the charger and the device being charged.

Don't ignore damaged cables: If you notice frayed or damaged charging cables, replace them immediately. Using damaged cables can lead to short circuits, overheating, or even pose a fire hazard. Once again, heading to Amazon or similar site to buy a knockoff may not be in your best interest long time. When my Apple charging cord needs to be replaced, I buy from Apple and know that I am getting the safest cable for charging my Apple device.

Don't charge in risky locations: Avoid charging your devices in locations where there's an increased risk of damage, such as near water sources or in dusty environments. Charging in safe and dry locations helps prevent accidents. Another risky place for those of you traveling this year is the airport. Do not plug in your USB port to charge in the convenient kiosks for charging. Hackers love to grab your data there. Instead use the charging "brick", plug your USB end of the cord into it and your device, and find an electrical outlet along the wall where you are waiting for your flight. Using the direct plug into an electrical outlet is much safer in the open airport environment.

Following these charging guidelines can help prolong the life of your devices and ensure a safer charging experience.




