
Capital Campaign for the Preservation Fund

It has been a year since the first committee work to start a preservation fund for our Clubhouse occurred in the Spring of 2022. As we look back on the past year, we are grateful for the support of our donors- clubwomen, local businesses, family, and friends, who responded to our request for help so that we can start on necessary repair and upgrade projects. With the recent merger of the 2021 Window Fund and the 2022 Preservation Fund, we are just shy of raising \$50,000. All contributions are listed in tiers for now.
