HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Long days in the summer sun can be dangerous for anyone if the necessary precautions aren't taken, and this is especially true for older adults.

According to the <u>Centers for Disease</u> <u>Control and Prevention</u>, people who are ages 65 and older are more prone to heat-related health problems. TECHNOLOGY CHAIR IN THE CORNER

If you've ever found yourself manually typing out information from images or struggling to make scanned documents into editable text, then there is a step-by-step process to unlock the potential of your images and convert any image into editable text right inside Microsoft Word—no additional plug-ins are required. Gone are the days of manual data entry or struggling with scanned documents. Follow these simple steps to harness the power of Word's built-in capabilities:

Step 1: Incorporate Your Image into Microsoft Word

Effortlessly insert your image by dragging and dropping it directly into Word or navigating to the Insert tab and selecting Pictures > This Device. Choose your image from your computer files and click Insert.

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Step 2: Tailor Image Size to Page Width

For optimal results, consider resizing your image to fit the page width. Start by cropping unwanted elements: right-click on the image, select Crop, refine the crop region to include only relevant content, then click outside the crop area to save changes. With the image selected, choose Layout Options > In Front of Text to freely adjust its size and position.

Step 3: Preserve Your Work as a PDF

Secure your document's integrity by saving it as a PDF. Navigate to the File tab, select Save As, designate a location and file name, ensure PDF format is selected, and click Save.

Step 4: Transition to Editable Text in Microsoft Word

Open your PDF in Word to initiate the automatic conversion to editable text. Navigate to the File tab, select Open, locate your PDF file, and click Open. Confirm by clicking OK in the dialog box that appears.

Microsoft Word's PDF conversion ensures accuracy, minimizing the need for extensive edits. Typically, only minor adjustments are necessary if any at all. Focus your efforts on formatting the document to your specifications or applying professional design elements.

Embrace the Power of Microsoft Word. Seize the opportunity to transform images into editable text effortlessly. Let Word streamline the process, freeing you from tedious manual entry. Beyond Word, explore alternative methods for image-to-

text conversion using free OCR software apps.
