Technology Chair in The Corner

For this month's important tech tip, I want to

share with your major points from an article created by Kim Komando whose daily technology blog/email I subscribe to and follow. Kim's article had information she said should be shared with



others. It is timely for you to consider as many people start shopping for their grandkids holiday presents as early as in the summer with the holidays only 5 months away.

This season we are bound to see a slew of AI ChatGPT-powered toys. When the kids start asking you for them, you need to know it is not all fun and games. These toys are not your average stuffed animal anymore. The toys can learn everything about the child and the child can have conversations with the toy. The more the child speaks, the more the toy learns and becomes more intelligent. chatbot technology can create customized stories for the child, can help them with temper tantrums and entertain them with the flip side that the toys may also collect school and home locations and other sensitive data. As you can imagine, the same privacy concerns you have as an adult with devices collecting, storing, and sharing with third party buyers now come into play.

Kim reminds everyone of Hello Barbie that came out in 2015. It was a Wi-Fi enabled doll that was the precursor to AI toys. The doll recorded, collected, and saved the conversations it had with children to cloud servers. Mattel got sued for invasion of privacy and security risks as the recorded data could be used for marketing purposes, and Mattel addressed the issues. Try to keep child's play private while it will eventually become impractical to avoid AI toys altogether as they are becoming a household norm. Disable any cameras and chat functions on the toys and enable parental controls. Read the gadget's privacy policy. Make sure there is a way to reset the toy to erase capabilities and memory. And think carefully before buying this type of toy. Stepping on Legos is not so bad if it protects our children. Hopefully, this knowledge will be power for you this upcoming holiday shopping season.

You are also encouraged to bring your own supplies, as well. We hope to have quite a few Valentines


ready next February to send to Vets here at home and active troops deployed abroad.

Beginning with the September 2023 meeting, we will once again be making reservations for in person attendance at our clubhouse meetings.


